They always lived in their birthplace, R.R. #1, Dunany, QC, where they farmed. She died March 2, 1928, and Henry in the Montreal General Hospital, October 14, 1942. Both are buried in the Louisa cemetery. They had 12 children, 3 dying as infants.

Henry Morrison (1859-I 942) farmed in The Glen, adjoining his father's farm. In the winters he did extensive lumbering from bush lots close by and sold the lumber at Lachute, QC. Henry Morrison's children's church memberships vary, according to one of his children. Robert and Arthur are Presbyterians; Walter, Edith, Mary and Wilma are Anglicans; Merinda belongs to the Church of God; and Wilfred is a Baptist.

PBBDBA Robert Henry Morrison, born Jan 24, 1885 at Louisa, QC. He had a fine farm half way between Lachute and St. Andrews. He kept purebred Ayrshires. He married Violet Kerr of Cushing, where she was born August 1, 1890 to Charlotte Lindley and William Kerr. Their 6 children were born at Lachute Road, R.R. #2, Lachute, QC, There 6 children are: Eva, Eileen, Roberta, Geraldine, Kenneth, and Isabelle. Several of these are married. Violet died December 12, 1933.

Robert Henry Morrison sold his farm during the summer of 1947 and moved to Lachute where he bought a new home on Sydney Street, Lachute, QC. His brother Wilfred also had a new home there.

PBBDBAA Eva Charlotte Kathleen Morrison, born August 16, 1917. At Lachute, QC, November 28, 1942 she married Delmar Cooke of Arundel, QC, where he was born on Mar, 22, 1915 to Mary Smith and William Cooke. **PBBDBD** Merinda Jane Morrison, born May 2, 1890 at the Glen. On January 3, 1946 she wrote: "I really never know much about the Parkers. My grandmother was Jane Parker. She married James Morrison. My father, Henry, was one of 11 children, 5 of whom died young: Rachel, Merinda, Sarah, Fanny, and little Jim. I think 4 of these 5 died of diphtheria, leaving the other 6 living, of whom 2 are still living. My first husband was Richard V. Matthews, He passed away 20 years ago past, on Ocoper 28. I came to the Eastern Townships to visit his family and 4 years later on December 3.71930 married Dalby Stephen Orr of East Angus, QC, and reside on a farm four miles out of East Angus. I know very little of my grandmother's people. I remember having met her brothers, Richard and Joe, who visited Grandma when I was very small. The two Morrison families (PBBA & PBBD) lived not far from each other all their married lives. William lived in Shrewsbury and James lived in The Glen on a farm. Dad's farm joined it, and Uncle Tom's farm joined ours. My nephew, Keith Amos Morrison now owns Uncle Tom's farm. My brother Walter of Verdun owns the house where my grandparents Morrison lived until they died. He has it for a summer home. Grandmother Jane Parker Morrison was a grand woman. We all loved her so much. She was so genuine and good. How I used to like to go and help her when I was a little girl, and she would let us hold pieces of paper on the spinning-wheel when she was spinning, and would tell us riddles, etc.. She could make men's and boys' clothing. Many times she helped my mother make clothes for Dad and the boys. I have never had any children of my own, but my first husband and I took two little boys. The oldest one, Clarence Herbert Matthews, was my husband's nephew. His daddy was accidentally killed by a train and left his wife with 5 little ones. We took Clarence before he was 5 years old. He is now married and living in Toronto. The other little boy was no relation but a next door neighbor. His mother died when Ward was 15 months old. He was the baby in a family of 5. We took him and, sad to say, he died overseas, January 1, 1945. It has been a dreadful shock to me. He was like my very own. Then Mr. Orr and I took little Edgar in December 1938, so he is the only one we have with us now. His mother was my own cousin. She died and left 9 little children, so we took Edgar. He will be 13 in March 1946. He is a fine healthy boy, going to East Angus high school. We live on a farm about 4 miles from the village. Edgar is a twin. My sister Mary has his twin sister, Evelyn, and my sister Edith has a brother. My cousin, Elsie (Edgar's own mother) had two sets of twins, two girls, Margaret and Elizabeth, and Edgar and Evelyn .... My grandmother had a cousin, Dawson Elliott, who lost his mind and always lived alone. He visited Grandma very often. I lived with my brother Robert (PBBDBA) and kept house for him for 2 or 3 years when he first bought his farm. I was then 19. The two Morrison families, married in 1857, were all members of the Anglican Church. My mother was born in Chatham and moved to Wentworth Township when she was 5. Her mother's name was Eliza Curran and married Arthur Tomalty. I never saw Arthur Tomalty; he died when I was a baby .... East Angus is a mill town. The Brompton Pulp and Paper Co. employ the most of the population of East Angus. It was just a year ago I learned of the death of my foster son, Ward Robert Gain, overseas." In Verdun, QC, on December 3, 1929, Merinda married Dalby Stephen Orr, who was born August 24, 1896 at South Dudswell, QC, to Mary and Samuel Orr. He is a farmer and they have lived since 1929 at East Angus, QC, R.R. #2. In 1947 Merinda wrote that her health had not been too good. "All our family of 9 were together

at Verda's wedding, June 7, 1949. We were all together June 1, 1946 at my sister Alice's 25'h anniversary. We had a grand time, such a happy reunion, at my sister's home in Verdun, QC. Dear old Aunt Mary was with us then too." She wrote February 3, 1950: "I saw Aunt Mary, the only one left of her family, at the 40th wedding anniversary of my brother Walter, September 15, 1949, at Louisa Hall, QC. The celebration was given them by their 7 children who were all present. Also the members of my family were present."

In Montreal on September 20, 1916 he married Pearl Handy of that city, where she was born January 4, 1894 to Margaret Aikin and John Handy. - PBBDBEF Joyce A. Morrison, born September 2, 1931 at Summerstown, ON. She attended Ottawa Normal School, finishing in May 1950.
- √PBBDBEG Mildred F. Morrison, born September 11, 1936 at Lancaster, ON. Though she has spastic paralysis, she has recently learned to walk and talk. She plays the piano by ear and has learned recently to play by note. She is very smart and has learned to read and write and do arithmetic.
- JPBBDBF --- Morrison, born c. 1893; died as an infant, not named.

PBBDBG Alice. Isabelle Morrison born December 6, 1894 at the Glen. At Lachute on June 1, 1921 she married George Robert Bale of Montreal, who was born March 30, 1895 at South Wigston, Leicestershire, England, to Elizabeth Finch and Joshua Gamble Bale. Since April 14. 1930 they have lived at 707 Rielle Avenue, Verdun, QC. For 5 years they lived at 4057
