On March 29, 1946 Alice wrote: "I know very little about Grandma Jane Parker Morrison's family. Minnie has met some of the Parkers near East Angus. Once she and my dad met some folks in a cemetery down there and it so happened they were both looking for the same grave, and they turned out to be cousins of my dad's. My husband came from the Midlands in England to Canada when he was 17. He has worked for the express company for about 27 years. Our one child, Elva Marjorie, is a schoolteacher, living at home and teaching in the Lasalle Road School in Verdun, completing her 4th term. She is quite fond of music and is quite closely connected with our church and the young people. She plays for the choir, etc.." Their 25th wedding anniversary was celebrated, June 1, 1946, with all 9 of her family present.

Alice died May 13, 1979, George October 23, 1984 and both are buried in the Lachute Protestant Cemetery.

✓ PBBDBGA Elva Marjorie Bale, born March 15, 1924 at 505 Galt Avenue, Verdun, QC. She is a music specialist in singing in three schools and lives with her parents: 707 Rielle Avenue, Verdun, QC.

PBBDBH Wilfred Jones Morrison, born October 6, 1897 at the Glen. At North Gore, QC, on May 1, 1918 he married Lewena S. Kerr of that place, where she was born August 12, 1897 to Lena Jane Graham (1862-1952) and Samuel Kerr (1857-1911). For many years he was a lumber and wood dealer and truck driver. He lived on the old Morrison farm and had 2 or 3 trucks and operated a mill. He followed the log, lumber, and wood business like his father. After 1939 he lived at Dunany, QC, RR. #1, but in 1947 moved to Lachute, QC, Box 9. He is now secretary-treasurer of the Township of Wentworth. Lewena helps him and both keep busy. All the family except Una belong to the Dalesville Baptist Church. They have 4 children. Lewena died in 1982 and Wilfred on December 7, 1983 and both are buried in the Lachute Protestant Cemetery.

PBBDBHA Una Doris Morrison, born November 18, 1918 at the Glen, Louisa, QC. At Lachute on December 20, 1938 Una married Colin Hamilton Copeland, Lachute, where he was born February 16, 1915 to Irene Hewitt and Maj. Melvin Copeland. Una wrote on March 6, 1950: "We belong to the Margaret Rodger Memorial Presbyterian Church. We were both educated at Lachute High School and Colin got his diploma in agriculture at MacDonald College, St. Anne de Bellevue, in 1933. Colin got his second name, Hamilton, from the Duke of Hamilton, an ancestor of his on his grandfather's side. We own a sterling silver snuff-box with the Duke's crest on it. On Colin's grandmother's side, she was a Walker, and her mother was Dunbar of the clan of Dunbar in Scotland. Her great grandfather was General Strachan. We have a dairy farm with 35 to 40 head of cattle on 300 acres of land, of which only about 80 to 100 are arable. We have a large sugar bush. We tap about 3,000 to 4,000 trees. Colin's grandfather bought this farm a half century ago and it has been in the family ever since." Address: Lachute, QC; 3 children. Colin died in 1975 and Una in 1977 and both are buried in the Lachute Protestant Cemetery.

! PBBDBHAA Dianne Irene Copeland, born January 27, 1942 at Lachute. Dianne died March 8, 1944 and is buried in the Lachute Protestant Cemetery.

'PBBDBHAB Linda Lewena Copeland, born June 9, 1944. She was adopted from the Protestant Foster Home of Montreal.

- ‘PBBDBHB Keith Amos Morrison, born April 11, 1921 at Brownsburg, QC. At Dalesville, QC, on August 19, 1944 he married Agnes Morrow of that place, where she was born September 23, 1923, to Bertha Tomalty and Austin Morrow. Keith does trucking and farming. He owns the farm once owned by his great uncle Tom. His family belong to the Regular Baptist Church, Dalesville, QC, which has also been his address since September 1949. They have 2 children.
- ✓ PBBDBHBA Karen Lee Morrison, born October 22, 1946 at the Glen.
- ‘PBBDBHBB Barrie Keith Morrison, born November 28, 1949 at Dalesville, QC.
- ✓PBBDBHC Lois Anita Morrison, born August 16, 1929 at Louisa, QC. Lois graduated from Lachute High School in June 1946 and commenced work in the Bank of Montreal in Lachute, working 2 years. Then she went to MacDonald College to prepare for teaching. She graduated there in June 1949 and taught her first year at St. Eustache sur le Lac, midway between Lachute and Montreal.
- ∨ PBBDBHD Audrey Helena Morrison, born April 10, 1935 at Louisa, QC. She is expects to go through grade 12. She plays the violin and plays in the school orchestra, Lachute, QC.
- ✓PBBDBI Edith Elizabeth Morrison, born September 1, 1900. Edith married Robert Albert Gain, a widower, of Dunany, QC. He had 5 children with his first wife. The 5 were born, 1909-1917, and were from 12 to 4 years of age when Edith married, June 15, 1921. The ceremony was performed in a Methodist parsonage in Lachute. Robert was born December 17, 1887 at Dunany, where he always lived, R.R. #1 . He died there October 23, 1944. His parents were Mary Ann Stephenson and Wm. John Gain. Robert was a farmer and belonged to the Anglican Church, which Edith also attends. On April 15, 1948 Edith married Thomas Lemuel Gauley and still lives at Dunany, via Lachute, QC, R.R. #1 . The Gain children (not Parker-Morrison descendants) are: (1) Albert T. Gain, born June 23, 1909; still single; (2) Alice Mary Gain, born March 18, 1911; married Davis O’Brien, Carillon, QC; (3) Chester H. Gain, born March 4, 1913, married Anna Bissell; wounded overseas but able to do light work; Grenville, QC; (4) Evelyn May Gain, born June 13, 1915, married David Girding, Lachute, QC; (5) Ward Robert Gain, born July 20, 1917, married Dorothy Cliffe, died overseas in England in World War II.
- ∨PBBDBJ Mary Margaret Morrison, born November 7, 1902 in the Glen, Wentworth County. At Lachute, QC, on February 18, 1920 she married William Thomas Brown of Shrewsbury, QC, where he was born, April 1, 1886 to Isabel Flaherty and William J. Brown. The Brown ancestors came from Ireland. Mary’s sister, Wilma, married her husband’s brother, Daniel. Mary and William farmed at Shrewsbury, but since 1942 they have lived at Undermount Farm, Lachute, QC, R-R. #6. They had 2 children who died: William and Mary. They adopted Violet, and cared for another girl whose mother had died. Mary helped the author considerably with the first Morrison information he received about this numerous clan.
William died on March 29, 1972 and Mary on May 30, 1987 and both are buried at the Lachute Protestant Cemetery.
- ✓ PBBDBJA William Brown, born 1921 at Shrewsbury, who died in infancy in 1921.
- ✓PBBDBJB Mary Morrison Brown, born 1935 at the Glen, prematurely, and died 1935.
- ✓PBBDBJC Violet Brown, born December 14, 1927.
- ✓PBBDBK Wilma Evelyn Morrison, born March 27, 1906 in the Glen. At Lachute on October 4, 1930 she married Daniel Brown of Shrewsbury, QC, where he was born November 19, 1893, to Isabel Flaherty and William J. Brown. He is a brother of Mary’s husband. Daniel is

a carpenter, and since 1929 he has lived in Dunany, via Lachute, QC, RR. #1. They have one son.

- ✓ PBBDBKA James Alvin Brown, born December 22, 1931 at Dunany, QC. James finished school in 1945.
- ✓ PBBDBKAA Merrill Alva Brown, born 1950.
- ✓ PBBDBKAB Janice Brown, born 1951.
- ✓ PBBDBL --- Morrison, born perhaps about 1907, or 1904, or 1896; one of the three of Henry Morrison's 12 children who died as infants.
- ✓ PBBDC Isabella Morrison, born November 1, 1861 at the Glen. She was a dressmaker and spent many years in Boston, Mass, but returned to the old home to live with her father after her mother's death in 1914. In 1921 she married William Kidd and lived on the old homestead in The Glen until her sudden death from pneumonia, February 26, 1924.
The St. Aidan's Anglican Church, Lake Louisa cemetery inscription reads:
In Memory of Isabella Morrison Wife of Wm. Kidd Born Nov. 1, 1861 Died Feb. 26, 1924.
- PBBDD Thomas Morrison, born October 19, 1863 at the Glen or Shrewsbury, QC. On July 4, 1893 he married Catherine Curran and settled on a farm next to PBBDB's, near the old homestead in the Gore. He was an Orangeman and belonged to the Rangers.
Thomas Morrison, born in 1863, married Catherine Curran and had 4 children: Eva, Lila, Leonard, and Ernest.
He farmed and did lumbering from bush lots in the Laurentians nearby. He died February 23, 1921, leaving two sons and two daughters, all born at The Glen.
- ✓ PBBDDA Eva Gertrude Morrison, born May 7, 1894. Eva is single and lives at 7774 Champagneur Street, Montreal, QC. Eva is a clerk in the Montreal Trust Co..
- ✓ PBBDDB Grace Lila Morrison, born February 26, 1896. In 1917 she married Alexander Tomalty, who died in 1933. She married Sidney Cloake in 1945 and lives in Montreal, QC.
- ✓ PBBDDC Thomas Leonard Morrison, born in July, 1897. Leonard lives at 34 Washburn Street, Newton, MA. Thomas Leonard married Emma Vaters in 1932. He is a carpenter and contractor in the Boston vicinity and lives in Newton, MA, where he and his wife, Emma, from Newfoundland, have 3 children.

- ✓ PBBDDD Gordon Ernest Morrison, born August 29, 1899. He is a builder and contractor and lives at Baie d'Urfe, QC, near St. Anne on Montreal island. He married Annie Rourke of Calumet, QC, and their have Doreen, and Loran.
In 1950 Gordon built Lloyd Parker's (PABIBB) house in Montreal at 12236 Guertin Street.

✓ PBBDE Mary Jane Morrison, born January 4, 1866 at the Glen, about two miles from Louisa, QC. At Lachute on June 16, 1886 Mary married Robert Tomalty of Louisa, where he was born, November 25, 1862 to Eliza Curran and Arthur Tomalty. Robert farmed at Louisa until his early death, January 4, 1903, leaving 5 children, ages 14 to 4 years. Since 1922 Mary has lived at Brownsburg, QC. She is the last of her family of 12. All her nephews and nieces take a special interest in her as a link with the past.

Mary Jane Morrison married Robert Tomalty at St. Simeon's Church, Lachute, QC. They farmed at Louisa, QC, until his death of Bright's disease, January 4, 1903. Mary, just 37; was left with the care of 5 children. They lived on the farm until the family grew up and were married. Mary then moved to Brownsburg, QC, where she still lives. A daughter wrote in 1951: "Mary has lived a very busy, useful, and active life. She is a devoted member of the Maple Avenue Baptist Church and lent her whole-hearted support to the various organizations in the church as long as she was able. Mary did practical nursing around the district and among her numerous relatives. She was never known to refuse to nurse or help those in need. Her hands were never idle, and her cheerful attitude reacted as a tonic to those who were ill. For these and scores of kindly acts she is loved and respected by town and country folk alike. She is known to one and all as 'Aunt Mary T.' In the earlier years before there were autos or telephones in the country, Mary had many a close race with the Stork; yet she always won out and has the proud record of delivering, or assisting the doctor (if he got there) in the birth of 324 babies without a single loss of life to either mother or child. Besides rearing her own 5 children, Mary is foster mother to Edith Winnifred Brown, born at Lachute, QC, on January 30, 1910, the daughter of Alex G. Brown (1872-1937) and his wife Edith Jane Boyd (1879-1910). Edith's mother died the day Edith was born and 'Aunt Mary' is the only mother Edith has ever known, as she has lived in her home since she was 7 weeks old. Today Edith is cheerfully repaying her debt by caring for 'Aunt Mary' and being a companion to her. Mary is in her 86th year, still blessed with a strong constitution. Though her eyesight is dimming and her step faltering, she manages to get around. She enjoys the family gatherings and never tires of the picturesque drives through the Laurentians."

✓ PBBDEA Mabel Louisa Tomalty, born November 5, 1888 at Louisa, QC, where on November 17, 1909 she married Nelson Bert Jones of Palmer, MA. He was born at Ware, MA, September 26, 1887, to Ira Lyman Jones and wife, Jane Thresher. He is a building contractor and carpenter. They have lived at 13 Maple Street, Palmer; Greenwich; 43 Maple Street, Warren, after 1938; and now at 160 Lincoln Street, West Medway - all in Massachusetts. In 1940 she wrote that she and Nelson were members of the Second Baptist Church in Palmer. "Nelson served as deacon for about 10 years before we moved from the town. He was also a member of the choir and various committees. He is a member of Thomas Lodge of Masons in Palmer, and of Reeve Chapter #40, O.E.S." in Palmer, and of Warren Grange #189 in Barren. While living in Palmer, I served as Supt. of the Primary Dept., President of the Ladies Aid, and sang in the choir. I am a member of Revere Chapter # 40, O.E.S., also of Warren Grange # 189, and MA State Grange." They have 3 children, all born in Palmer, MA, 1916-1926.

✓ PBBDEAA Gordon Edwin Jones, born August 7, 1916. In February 1940, his mother wrote: "Gordon is a member of Second Baptist Church, Palmer. He had a 7-year perfect attendance record in the Sunday School when we moved from the town. He is a graduate of Belchertown High School and Bay Path Institute, Springfield, MA. He belongs to Warren Grange and MA State Grange. He is employed by the State as a junior engineering aid. His business address is 35 Main Street, Natick, MA. He is an accountant."

On March 6, 1941 he married Lucia Buzzell and has 2 children: Richard Nelson Jones, born June 6, 1943; and Carol Louise Jones, born October 28, 1947. Gordon is employed in radar work and lives at West Brookfield, MA.

- √ PBBDEB Gladys Jane Tomalty, born November 2, 1890. At Kerrobert, SK, on December 3, 1918, she married Norval Warren Blair of that place, who was born at Ogdensburg, QC, April 11, 1889 to Jane Hornor and William Blair. Gladys and her sister Mabel attended MacDonald College and taught school until they married. All her mother's family are Baptists except Gladys, who belongs to the United Church. She belongs to the L.O.B.A." and was Mistress for a number of years in Kerrobert, SK. Norval was born c. 16 miles from Louisa, QC, near Grenville on the Ottawa River. He went West in his early teens and homesteaded at Kerrobert, where he farmed extensively until 1936, when they moved to Saskatoon, SK. Address: 624 23rd Street, W.. He is a farmer, live-stock buyer, implement salesman, and collector. They have no children. On July 13, 1945 Gladys wrote: "I attended public school at Louisa, took high school at Lachute Academy, and graduated in 1908 from MacDonald College, McGill University, School for Teachers. I won several scholarships in high school and into McGill. I also was very successful in teaching, most of which was in 'The Lachute Inspectorate'. I taught 3 years at Kerrobert. Since marrying I have taken an active part in practically all organizations for the welfare of the community. We are members of the United Church. I am secretary of the Women's Assn., a member of the Y.W.C.A., of the Executive Committee of the War Services Club, Block Leader of the Women's Volunteer Services, Past Mistress of the L.O.B.A., President of the Home Makers Club, active on the Local Council of Women, and I try to do a share of Red Cross work. I am particularly fond of painting, art, and needle work, but my health has been poor the last few years, so I am unable to keep up with all my ambitions. I like dramatics, too, and used to direct plays frequently when we lived on the farm at Kerrobert."
